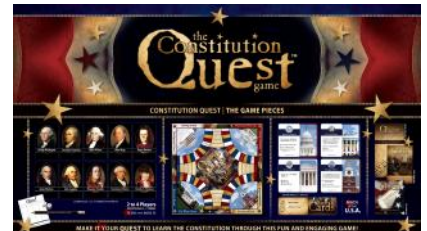

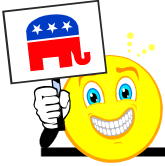

Members of the La Jolla Club attended Leadership training on Jan 14th sponsored by the SDCFRW. Sixteen workshops covered almost all aspects of the Club's work. Participants received instruction in legislation, campaigns and petitions, immigration issues, education, scholarships, community service, youth outreach and using social media such as Facebook and Twitter to get the word out.

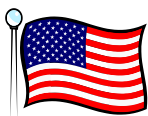
Educate others through conversation and, hopefully, the power of suggestion will permeate their subconscious mind.
